- Explain the strengths and weakness of various screening tests including coronary artery calcium scores, carotid intimal medial thickness, ankle/brachial indices, and C-reactive protein.
- Apply risk assessment in your practice, including new concepts.
- Utilize best practices for assessment and management of chest pain, murmurs, and edema/CHF.
